Reading

*** Note: EARLY BIRD SPECIAL! Registration Fee is waived for families who enroll in 2 or more weeks and pay all camp fees in full by Monday, March 5.**

Registration fee is used to defray the costs of daily trips, camp T-shirt, academic workbooks, etc. and is separate from the weekly camp fee.

Cancellations made *before* Tuesday, May 1st will receive a full refund minus the registration fee. (This includes a deduction in the amount refunded for campers who enroll via the Early Bird Special.) Cancellations made on Tuesday, May 1st or thereafter are non-refundable.

After May 1st full payment of camp fees plus the applicable registration fee is due at the time of booking.

There is a **\$15.00 change fee** if you wish to switch weeks in your reservation. Changes can be made on a space available basis.

There is a **late pick-up fee** of \$10.00 for pick-ups during the first 10 minutes after closing (5:30). After that time there is an additional \$1.00 per minute pick-up charge.

We reserve the right to discontinue services if a camper is unable or unwilling to follow camp rules and/or behavior guidelines. Camp fees will be forfeited.

Eligibility

Campers must be 6 by the first day of camp (or have completed a full year of kindergarten in a traditional school setting).

Due to the academic nature of our program students with learning disabilities or other special needs should discuss the appropriateness of our program with our Director of Admissions prior to enrollment (Scott Mitchell 688-3040).

Other:

Doors open at 8:00AM. There is no early morning drop-off option.

Campers bring lunch and one morning snack (afternoon snack is provided).

Transportation is via Camelot Academy school bus (outfitted with seatbelts) and counselor automobiles.
