The Edu-Camp Program

Reading

- Daily reading instruction in an individualized program tailored to your student's needs.
- Instructional components include phonics, reading for meaning, oral reading and vocabulary development.

Writing

- Daily writing assignments individualized to maintain/improve your child's written expression.
- Instructional components include basic grammar, sentence and paragraph structure and the building blocks of good story and essay writing.

Arithmetic

- Daily drills on math facts and word problems.
- Individualized math program that allows a student to work on appropriate skills/concepts from general math through Algebra 1.

Edu-camp General Information

Camp fees

\$ 225.00/week payable 50% at time of registration and 50% on Monday, May 3, 2010.

Non-refundable registration fee of \$30 for one week, \$50 for two weeks, \$75 for three weeks \$100.00 for four or more weeks. (Waived for families who enroll in four or more weeks and pay all of the camp fees by Monday, March 15. Please note: \$100 will be non-refundable in the event of cancellation before Monday, May 3, 2010)

Registration fee is not deducted from camp fees. It is used to defray the costs of daily trips, camp T-shirt, academic workbooks, etc.

3% administrative fee (waived for cash and check payments).

Cancellations made before May 3rd will receive a full refund minus the \$100.00 registration fee. Cancellations made on May 3rd or thereafter are non-refundable.

After May 3rd registration must include full payment plus the \$100.00 registration fee.

There is a **\$15.00 change fee** if you wish to switch weeks in your reservation. Changes can be made on a space available basis.

There is a **late pick-up fee** of \$10.00 for pick-ups during the first 10 minutes after closing (5:30). After that time there is an additional \$1.00 per minute pick-up charge.

We reserve the right to discontinue services if a camper presents behavioral problems. Camp fees will be forfeited.

Eligibility

Campers must be 6 by the first day of camp (or have completed a full year of kindergarten in a traditional school setting).

Due to the academic nature of our program students with learning disabilities or other special needs should discuss the appropriateness of our program with our Director of Admissions prior to enrollment (Scott Mitchell 688-3040).

Other

Doors open at 8:00AM. There is no early morning drop-off option.

Campers bring lunch and one morning snack (afternoon snack is provided).

Transportation is via Camelot Academy school bus outfitted with seatbelts.
