These adventures will be laden with fun quests, daring risks and fearsome dragons! Noah Basil, founder of Guild of Adventures, will serve as Dungeon Master through these stories that students will largely create for themselves. Armed with pencil, paper, and dice your children will create a character for themselves and play as that character through adventures.
