College Track Program Placement Rubric

Being part of the College Track Program means a senior is committed to completing all requirements for a high school diploma and is on a path toward college. The Camelot Guidance Office is glad to support seniors through the college application process for as long as they remain in the College Track Program and continue meeting its requirements. Since program requirements are varied and ongoing, this rubric is meant to help everyone see where a student stands and what support they may need to enter and stay in the College Track Program.

Criterion	Unsatisfactory	Satisfactory
Senior Interview if provided/required Faculty interviewers will share feedback on the student's performance and readiness.		
*Credit Requirements All credits needed to meet minimum requirements are completed by the end of junior year.		
GPA A cumulative GPA of 3.0 or above is considered satisfactory; below 3.0 is considered unsatisfactory.		
*Disciplinary Standing Having no disciplinary action is satisfactory. A Disciplinary Warning or Disciplinary Probation is considered unsatisfactory.		
*Attendance The student maintains a healthy level of attendance (see Handbook).		
Parental Support Parents complete the Parent Response Form and join meetings and conferences with the Guidance Office.		
*Academic Standing No incomplete grades, and no Academic Warning or Probation.
