College Track Program Placement Rubric

Being in the College Track Program means that the senior is committed to meeting all requirements towards a high school diploma and is college bound. The Camelot Guidance Office will assist the senior through the college application process as long as the student remains on the College Track and meets all the requirements to continue in the program. Requirements for program participation are many, varied and ongoing. The following rubric will help determine the student's readiness to enter the College Track Program with the Camelot Guidance Office support.

*Attendance: The student must maintain an appropriate level of attendance. (See Handbook)		
Parental Support: Parent Response Form. Attend all meetings and conferences with Guidance Office.		
*Academic Standing: No Incompletes. No Academic Warning/Probation.
